During the last election, the rural parts of our country turned out in record numbers at the polls. This trend has continued leading up to this November's election. Following the success of NRECA's Co-ops Vote campaign in 2016, this non-partisan project was designed to inform cooperative members on the key issues facing electric Co-ops. Co-ops Vote does not focus on things like endorsing or recommending any candidate for election, but rather, educates members about three very important issues during this election year:

- Expanding broadband coverage throughout rural America;
- Ensuring continued access to reliable electricity;
- Promoting the work of co-ops within the communities they serve.

Choptank Electric Cooperative members demonstrate time and again the importance of voting, most recently during the broadband through member regulation campaign. Overwhelmingly, members made their voices heard and voted YES for broadband through member regulation. In the coming week, Choptank Electric Cooperative encourages members to make their voices heard again.

Exercising your right to vote is imperative to our families, our neighbors, and our communities. As we move forward with our broadband deployment efforts it is equally important that we elect public officials who can be champions for our rural communities and will help us support our efforts.

The VMDAEC Scholarship is Accepting Applications

High school or homeschooled seniors graduating in spring 2021 are eligible.

Electric cooperatives in Virginia, Maryland, and Delaware are preparing to accept applications for their popular scholarships from high school seniors who intend to pursue higher education studies.

The scholarships are awarded by the Virginia, Maryland & Delaware Association of Electric Cooperatives (VMDAEC) Education Scholarship Foundation, which since 2001 has provided almost 800 scholarships totaling more than \$740,000 to graduating high school students.

"This program has helped hundreds of students advance their education and demonstrates once again how electric cooperatives are committed to their member-consumers and the communities they serve," said Richard G. Johnstone Jr., president and CEO of the VMD Association.

The open date for applications is Sunday, November 1, 2020, while the application deadline is Friday, February 19, 2021. Award recipients will be notified no later than June 1, 2021. The online application and additional information is posted at <u>www.vmdaec.com/</u> <u>scholarship</u>.

Any high school or homeschooled senior graduating in spring 2021, and whose primary residence is served by a VMD member cooperative, is eligible to apply for a \$1,000 scholarship to be applied to a two- or four-year college or trade school.

An applicant must be entering his or her first semester at a post-secondary or technical/trade school in the fall of 2021. Scholarship funds, which will be sent directly to the educational institu-



tion, must be used toward tuition, student fees, room and board, or textbooks.

To be considered complete, SAT and/or ACT score reports must come from the College Board. A score report must be uploaded by the student in the online application system. Scores listed on transcripts do not qualify. If a student has taken the SAT more than once, he or she can take the best score from each test ("Super Score"), but both tests must be submitted in the package to qualify.

If a student's ability to take a test has been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, special arrangements may be made.

The Foundation's board of directors will select recipients based on these weighted criteria: financial need at 40%, academic achievement at 40% and personal statement at 20%.
